 - When the power recovers, operation resumes from where it stopped. (Auto Restart)




- For normally soiled laundry at the rated capacity, we recommend using the "Cotton, 40 °C, 1000 r/min, RINSE+, 2" which is tested in accordance with IEC 60456 and/or MS IEC 60456 for the energy and water efficiency aspects.
- Actual water temperature may differ from the declared cycle temperature.
- The test results depend on water pressure, water hardness, water inlet temperature, room temperature, type and amount of load, degree of soiling, utilized detergent, fluctuations in the main electricity supply and chosen additional options.
- Pre-wash process is applied to only "Baby care" washing course.






Press on opposing corners of the top to check that the feet don't wobble.













Connecting the Hoses

Maximum connection distances for hoses and the power cord









Water supply hose

- Do not twist, squash, modify or cut the hose.









Drain hose


Draining to a sink or wash basin




Draining to a floor directly
