

- During setup, make sure that all screws are securely tightened.
- Ensure that the TV does not suffer any impact during installation of the pedestal.
- Ensure that children do not climb onto the pedestal.
- Install or remove the TV from the pedestal with at least two people.
- Install or remove the TV by the specified procedure.

Ventilation

Caution

Allow sufficient space around the TV in order to help prevent excessive heat, which could lead to early failure of some electronic components.

Minimum distance (cm)





- Ventilation should not be impeded by covering the ventilation openings with items such as newspapers, tablecloths and curtains.
- Whether you are using a pedestal or not, always ensure the vents at the bottom of the TV are not blocked and there is sufficient space to enable adequate ventilation.

Built-in wireless LAN


Preparation

Take out the pedestal and the TV from the packing case and put the TV onto a work table with the screen panel down on the clean and soft cloth (blanket, etc.)

- Use a flat and firm table bigger than the TV.

- Make sure not to scratch or break the TV.




Removing the pedestal from the TV




Warning

- When optional accessories such as wall brackets etc. are used, always read and follow the manufacturer installation and usage instructions.
- Do not mount the unit directly below ceiling lights (such as spotlights or halogen lights) which typically give off high heat. Doing so may warp or damage plastic cabinet parts.
- When installing wall brackets you must ensure the wall bracket is not electrically grounded to metal wall studs. Always ensure that there are no electrical cables, pipes etc. in the wall before you begin the wall bracket installation.

Connecting the TV


- Please ensure the TV is disconnected from the mains socket/ power point before attaching or disconnecting any RF/ AV leads.
- External equipment and cables are for illustrative purposes only and not supplied with this TV.
- Check the type of terminals and cable plugs are correct when connecting.
- When using an HDMI cable, use the fully wired one.
- Keep the TV away from electronic equipment (video equipment, etc.) or equipment with an infrared sensor. Otherwise, distortion of image/ sound may occur or operation of other equipment may be interfered.
- Also read the manual of the equipment being connected.



Aerial



- Keep RF (aerial) cable away from the mains lead to avoid and minimise mains interference pickup.


Initial Setup

Searching for accessories...

Before pairing your Bluetooth devices, make ure they're in pairing mode. To start pairing a remote, hold (-) and (-) for ubout 5s, then release it.

How to Pair Remote Control with the TV

This is a Bluetooth remote control, and before using it, please pair it with the TV firstly. When TV is turned on for the first time, a pairing process for your remote will be performed during the initial setup. Your remote control should automatically pair with your TV at this point.

You can add an additional Voice Remote with Google to your TV, or you may also need to replace one if your old one broke. Other Bluetooth devices like speakers, games controllers can also be connected via Bluetooth. The following steps are for your reference:

Step 1: Press f button to enter the home page.

Step 2: Press $\blacktriangle / \checkmark / \checkmark / \checkmark$ to choose O to enter.

You can also directly select the 🗿 button on the remote control.

Step 3: Press ▲/▼/◀/► to choose Remotes & Accessories, and press OK to enter.

Step 4: Press ▲/▼/◀/► to choose Pair accessory and press OK to enter.

NOTE: Under this menu, you can choose turn Bluetooth on or off, Add a new Remote & Accessories or set up a remote control or accessory that's already connected to your TV.

Follow the on screen instructions to pair it. (Press hold \leftarrow and \Uparrow for 5 seconds on the "new" remote. Once it is discovered, it will appear in the list. And then press OK on your "old" remote to confirm adding this new remote).

NOTE: If you experience difficulties in pairing your remote with your TV you can turn off other wireless devices and try again.

If you want to unpair the Bluetooth remote, follow these steps:

Step 1: Press f button to enter the home page.



2 Voice On / Voice Off

1. Pair the Bluetooth remote first.

2. Press the remote-control voice button four times, pausing at least 3 to 4 seconds between each keystroke.



3. Select "Yes, I'm in" to activate the system to start the voice module, and the prompt disappears, and it can be used.

- Follow the steps that appear on the screen, you can say "Ok Google" to use voice function, and the indicator will lighting when the TV receives the voice, then directly say your request.
- Turn it right to set it Off to exit voice function, indicator light will go to yellow.





Virtual Keyboard:Turn the virtual keyboard on, press BACK key to close.

- Country and Region: Show your country or region.

- Auto Scan: Use ▲/▼ to choose Cable+Antenna, Cable and Antenna. Press OK to start the automatic search process. The search may take a few minutes. During the process, you can press ← to abort.

- Manual Scan: Use ▲/▼ to choose Digital, Press OK to enter the interface. Press ▲/▼/◀/► to set Channel Number, Frequency(KHz) and BandWidth(M), then select Start Scan to start the search channel.

Use ▲/▼ to choose Analog, Press ▲/▼to set Scan Type Program, TV System and Color System item, then Press

▲/▼select Frequency and Press OK to Start Scan.

Digital Channel Setup:

To select the option to adjust the Audio Setup.

Audio Setup: Press OK to enter the Audio Language and then setup your Audio Language.

- EPG: Press **OK** to enter the Program Guide menu.
- Favorite: Setup favorite channel list.

Press **OK**/► to display some signal information on current digital channel, such as signal strength,





Screen

Red, blue, green or black spots on the screen.

Chaotic image, noisy.

No image is displayed.

Sound
